

Timber Sale Design from a Wildlife Habitat Perspective



A well planned timber harvest can improve wildlife habitat. But not all harvests are created equal. With both classroom and field activities, we will review the basic needs of wildlife species, then take a practical look at timber sale design through the eyes of a wildlife manager. Instructors will include both wildlife managers and foresters. The workshop will include a combination of classroom presentations, harvest site visits, small-group exercises, and discussion. The workshops are designed for both natural resource managers and logging contractors.

Instructors: Vary by location. DNR Forestry and Wildlife staff, private consulting foresters, others.

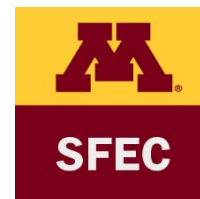
Fees: \$75 SFEC members, \$140 others. No charge for MLEP members registering through MLEP.
